War is bad, heaven knows, but slavery is far worse. If the doom of slavery is not sealed by the war, I shall curse the day I entered the Army, or lifted a finger in the preservation of the Union. Of the old Union we have had enough and more than enough.—Walter Stone Poor (Maine soldier), letter to George Fox (May 15, 1861)

The American Civil War preserved the Union of the states, ended slavery in the US, and was the costliest, in loss of life in American History. It was a defining moment in American History.

Maine was involved in every aspect of the Civil War. Maine provided many political leaders, generals, soldiers, nurses, and agency leaders before, during, and after the war.

Kippy is A one-woman imagining of the late, great Kip Tiernan, social justice hero. Kippy was an extraordinary character and a force of nature who changed the face of social justice in Boston. Passionate and salty-tongued, she engendered outrage and empathy for the plight of poor and homeless women. She founded Rosie's Place in 1974, the first-ever homeless sanctuary for women in the US. In addition, Kip Tiernan was also the founder of The Greater Boston Food Bank and many other organizations that helped the poor and disenfranchised people of Boston.

Gail Phaneuf has devoted her entire career to theatre. As a playwright and composer, Phaneuf has penned three full musicals and sixteen plays, performed at venues around the world. Her award-winning MONSTERS! A Midlife Musical Meltdown, originally premiered in Boston, will be playing at Deertrees Theatre this August 16-18th, and she will be joining the cast in the role of FEAR. Her teen

musical, The Love Note has been performed at countless theatres, schools and camps all over the world, including an Off Broadway run in 2014.

Maine Mineral and Gem Museum

The Senior College has arranged to have a tour of the Maine Mineral and Gem Museum in Bethel, Maine led by Jim Mann. "The Museum showcases our geological history, displays renowned mineral and rock collections and provides educational opportunities for the novice and expert alike. MMGM displays one of the world's foremost collections of extraterrestrial rocks—meteorites from Mars, the Moon and the Asteroid Belt that teach us about the origins of our Solar System. MMGM is a one-of-a-kind, world-class museum located a stone's throw away from the Western Maine mines that once sheltered these mineral treasures."

Due to insurance the College is not able to arrange transportation. Everyone will need to arrange their own transportation. Cost of class is the \$12.00 admission fee to the Museum.

Jim Mann had a career as a professional gem cutter for 55 years and metalsmith for nearly 40 years. Jim met Larry Stifler and Mary McFadden (philanthropists and founders of the museum) in 2004 and expressed the idea that Maine's mineral and gem history was being lost. Months later he started acquiring collections and important historical memorabilia and made over 104 acquisitions for what is now called the Maine Mineral and Gem Museum. Jim became a member of Gallery 302 in 2017.
